Nuclear Reform Monitoring Committee Report on the Status of Preparations for the Restart of Kashiwazaki-Kariwa Nuclear Power Station Unit 7 has been received

Between May 13-17, 2024, the Nuclear Reform Monitoring Committee (hereinafter referred to as, "NRMC") reviewed the status of preparations for the restart of TEPCO Kashiwazaki-Kariwa Nuclear Power Station (hereinafter referred to as, "KK") Unit 7.

We received a report from the NRMC. They reviewed the status of safety improvement initiatives implemented to date as part of nuclear safety reforms through field inspections and interviews with plant personnel.

The report states that, "the review did not identify any nuclear safety concerns or safety issues and found that safety culture is healthy. The review team arrived at the conclusion that TEPCO is making sound and adequate preparations for the restart of KK Unit 7."

In light of the lessons we learned from the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station Accident, TEPCO will continue to strive to further improve safety and reliability.
