

Extension of Co-operation Agreement with Sellafield Ltd., UK

In September 2014, Tokyo Electric Power Company Holdings, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as, "TEPCO HD") signed a co-operation agreement with Sellafield Ltd., a UK firm that engages in the decommissioning of reactors and radioactive waste facilities, in accordance with which experience and expertise pertaining to decommissioning is shared. The original term of the agreement was five years and then it has been renewed approximately every five years thereafter while making continuous revisions. TEPCO HD hereby announces that a ceremony was held on September 11 (local time) at the Sellafield site (Seascale, Cumbria, UK) to celebrate the second agreement extension that was agreed upon in April 2025.

*Sellafield Ltd.: Subsidiary of the UK Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) which was founded in 2005. Is engaged in the decommissioning of the Windscale nuclear reactor as well as facilities that pose a high risk of radiation leaks, referred to as legacy facilities, as well as the implementation of risk mitigation measures.

■ Agreement overview

The objective of the agreement is to leverage lively information exchanges to solve issues common to both companies in order to move steadily forward with decommissioning in a safer manner. The areas of expertise on which information is shared includes site operation and management, environmental monitoring, radiation protection, project management, design engineering, stakeholder communications and engagement, and procurement strategies.

Since FY2018, TEPCO HD has been dispatching its employees to Sellafield Ltd., and through these exchanges, Sellafield Ltd. has provided us with advanced and useful knowledge for the decommissioning work at the Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Station.
